
Outdoor Safety

Camping Safety Tips:

- Choose as flat a surface you can find for your tent or trailer. Observe if there are any risk in your location. (leaning trees, holes etc)
- Bring plenty of food and water, some campsites are not fully serviced. Check ahead before arrival.
- Be aware of the weather conditions leading up to and during your stay
- Keep first aid kits on hand
- Pack out what you packed in, leave no garbage behind.
- Ensure food is put away & camp remains clean to avoid encounters with wildlife. Make sure to not feed the animals.
- Remember allergy medications, EPI Pen and bug spray!
- Never leave a fire unattended, always stoke, douse with water and repeat, until satisfactory
- Keep an eye out for wildlife or presence of
 - Carry bear spray, bear bangers etc if in bear country



Boating Safety Tips:

- Always wear a life jacket, and to ensure proper fit, check with the manufactures size chart on the life jacket
- Balance the boat, ensure equal distribution on both sides to avoid capsizing.
- Communicate and establish effective hand signals if carrying out water activities
- Check the weather conditions before you head out
- Ensure your boat is equipped with appropriate survival kits
- In case of engine failure, have oars onboard
- An operator of a "pleasure craft" (boat, seadoo etc) is required to have a PCOC: Pleasure craft operator card, which means that the holder of the card has successfully completed a boating safety course.
