## Hunting Safety for Non-hunters

Follow these safety tips during hunting season:

- ☐ Wear bright colored clothing, don't forget about household animals if they are accompanying you
- ☐ Make yourself known by, making noise, whistling, singing, and holding a conversation
- ☐ Learn where hunting activities take place and be courteous once a hunter is aware of your presence
- ☐ Chose a different time to explore



## Are you looking to hunt and don't know your first steps?

- 1) Complete a CFSC, Canadian Firearms Safety Course then apply for your PAL, Possession Acquisition License.
- 2) Alberta Hunter Education Certificate
- 3) Obtain a WIN Card to apply for draws, purchase wildlife certificates, licenses and replacements
- 4) Hunting Method
- 5) Review Regulations
- 6) Find a place to Hunt

## Hunting on Crown or Private Land

**Private Land:** permission from the landowner is required to be able to hunt, and can be denied for any reason

**Provincial Grazing Reserves:** Under the recreational Access Regulation, contact is required for some grazing reserves.
