OUTDOOR

- Make sure to use appropriate Christmas lights rated for either indoor or outdoor use
- Inspect your lights before handing, ensure bulbs are replaced and internal conductors are not exposed
- Before install, verify how many light strings can be connected to one another

Safety Tips for the Holiday Connoisseur

- □ Inspect yard decorations and ensure proper operation
- □ ALWAYS INSPECT YOUR LADDER BEFORE USE
- Use a correctly sized ladder appropriate for the task, extend the ladder past the roof and ensure the ladder is positioned on a flat surface
- Use 3-point contact on a ladder and have a secondary person accompany you by observing or holding the ladder
- □ Wear appropriate winter gear
- Turn off Christmas lights / yard decorations when away from home.





INDOOR

- If you have a real Christmas tree, make sure to routinely water it, as this will decrease the chances of the tree drying out and becoming a fire hazard
- Keep any exposed flames, like candles, away from the tree and children away from sources of heat or flame
- Keep small ornaments away from children, any object small enough to fit through a toilet paper tube can obstruct their airway.
- Mistletoe, holly berries and poinsettias are toxic when ingested and should be kept out of reach from children
- Avoid overloading your electrical circuits, use power strips with built in circuit breakers
- Turn off all Christmas lights before bed
