- Strategies for responsible energy development, sustainable farming and ranching, recreation, forest management, and nature-based tourism

Forest Management Agreement (FMA)

- Long-term (20-year) renewable forest tenure
- •Grants the company rights to establish, grow, harvest and remove Crown timber within the FMA area
- •Specifies the requirements for the company to develop of a Forest Management Plan
- Requires the creation and maintenance of a forest inventory
- FMA holders must consider a broad range of forest values as social, economic, and environmental factors
- •FMA0100038: May 1, 2015 April 30, 2035
- •FMA2100047: May 1, 2021 April 30, 2041

- Describes long term (10-year) sustainable forest management activities, includes:

- Values, Objectives, Indicators and Targets (VOITs)
- Classified Landbase
- •Timber-volume vield curves
- Preferred Forest Management Scenario
- •Reforestation Strategy

- Spatial Harvest Sequence (SHS) output provides the implementation strategy to achieve the 200-year forecasted future forest conditions

- Practices used in all aspects of timber harvest planning and operations
- Implements decisions made in higher order plans
- Alberta developed and standardized with area-specific customized strategies
- Includes submission and approval criteria for operational plans
