

Fire Watch and Patrol



Fire Watch

The fire watch must know the locations of the **muster point**, **closest fire alarm pull station** (or how to raise the alarm), and **have an available fire extinguisher and/or fire hose that they are trained to use.**



- The fire watch has the authority to **STOP** the hot work if unsafe conditions develop.
- When a worker is fire watching, they can't perform any other task and must always be able to see the hot work.
- Once the hot work is completed, they must inform the Permit Authorizing Individual or Supervisor.
- One hour after the hot work is done, or during any meal or coffee breaks, the fire watch must stay on location.

Fire Patrol

The Fire Patrol periodically inspects the area three times (once an hour for three hours after the hot work is completed). They must know what task is being performed and what the hazards are.
