

What is Lock Out Verification?



Every time locks are applied and/or equipment de-energized, it must be verified and the verification must be documented for accuracy and completion.

The purpose of lockout verification is to confirm that the lockout applied covers the scope of the job, the lockout points are isolated correctly, check that the worker is locking out on the correct lockout, and to document this verification on the Verification of Individual Lock(s) Form or FLHA card.

Lockout Verification is on the back of FLHA cards!

Assigned Verifiers

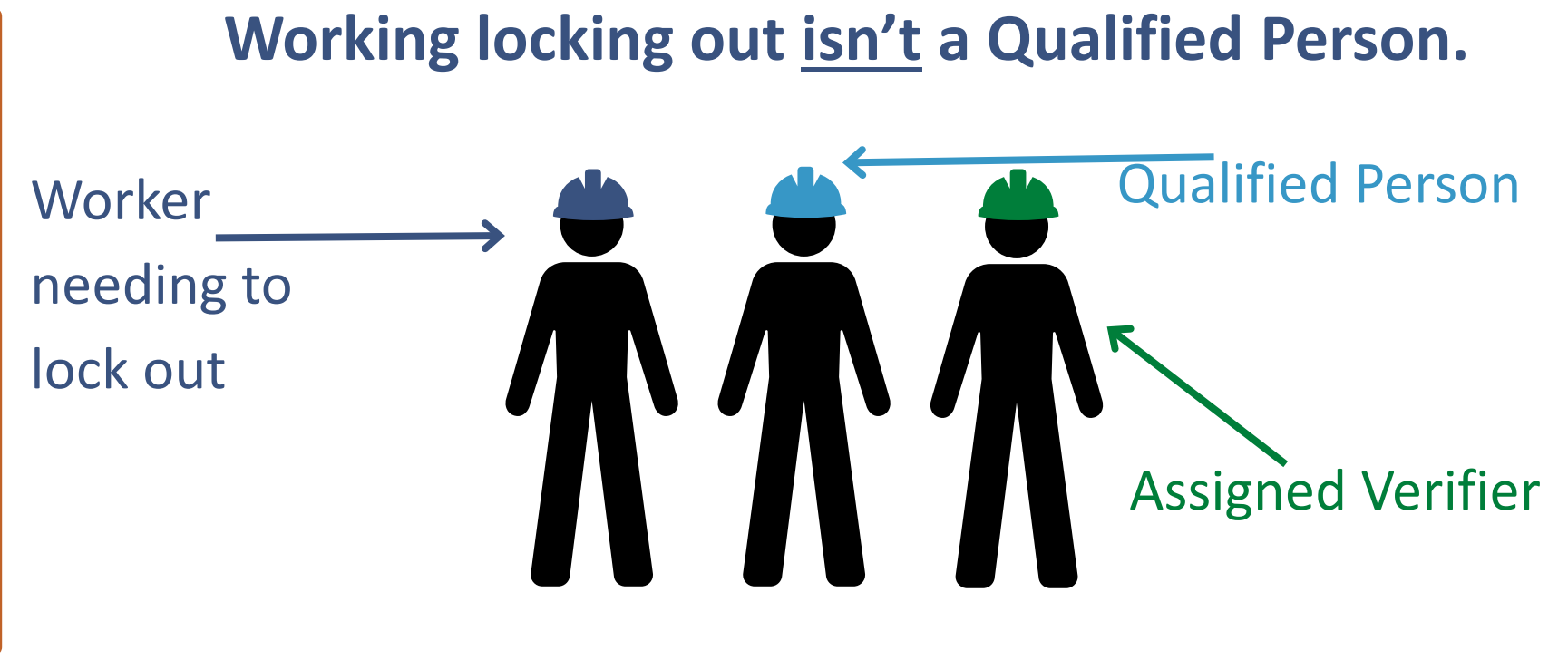
An assigned verifier is a person trained to verify lockouts through the successful completion of the CPP Lockout Verification Training Program. They are shown all the lockout points applicable for a specific job.

Qualified Persons

A person qualified to do multi-point, confined space, and individual lockouts within a certain area. They have received training in Lockouts through both Cariboo Pulp's Lockout Modules, and their position's training workbooks. They can sign off on a lockout checklist confirming that the lockout covers the scope of the work to be performed, the lockout points are correctly isolated, the locks have been applied to the appropriate points, and an isolated/de-energized state has been confirmed where possible.

Minimum Number of People Involved in the Lockout

Workers needing to lock out an area may have personal locks, but that doesn't mean that they are qualified to complete a lockout. If a non-Qualified worker needs an area locked out, a Qualified Person must complete a lockout checklist with them, and an assigned verifier (different than the Qualified Person) must then verify the lockout.



Verification must happen before entering or performing work on a locked-out area!
