

PINE MANAGEMENT TRAILS

The Pine Management Trail is located at the Gregg Cabin Recreation Area. This popular campground is home to the historic Gregg Cabin, which was built in 1917 by the Dominion Forest Service. The trail itself is approximately six kilometres long and can be hiked at a leisurely pace in less than 2.5 hours (although there are shorter options).

On this trail, the hiker, biker or ATV user can see the effects of the 1956 Gregg Burn, which at 8,700 hectares was one of the last large forest fires in this area; although a fire around Christmas in 1997 just to the west of the trails threatened to exceed this mark, but was held to 2,200 hectares through aggressive fire fighting.

GREGG CABIN CAMPGROUND

The Gregg Cabin Campground is an 11-site campground located at the main entrance of the Pine Management Trails. The campground has a large log picnic shelter and can be booked (through reservations) as a group campground (in which case the gates to the campground entrance might be locked), or when the campground is not being used by a group, individual sites can be reserved. This is an ATV friendly campground – we just ask that machines do not run between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. If the campground is booked by a group (and the gates locked), the Pine Management Trails are still accessible by a number of other different entrance points (see map).
